2011 Gizzard Fest Fishing Tournament Rules

Official Fishing Derby Rules**

Fishing Hours: 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. There will be a signal starting and stopping the tournament.

Eligibility: Children and adults

Boat fishing will not be permitted during the tournament, only fishing from the bank will be allowed

Scoring Fish: This is a catch and release tournament. We require all fish caught to be released after they have been scored.

The length of each fish caught by a participating person must be entered on your official score card by a tournament official only. **DO NOT MAKE ANY ENTRIES ON YOUR SCORE CARD. ALL CARDS MUST BE RETURNED NO LATER THAN 10:05 A.M. OR YOU WILL BE DISQUALIFIED AND YOUR SCORE CARD WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED!**

When you catch/land a fish, get the attention of an official tournament scorer. The official will measure your fish and mark it on your score card. Once your fish has been measured and entered on your score card, you must release the fish back into the lake. Scorers will be located around the lake and will continually move around to assist participants.

We must rely on everyone's honesty to make this tournament fair. Once a fish has been scored, it must be immediately released.

Prizes: Children catching the largest fish, Adults catching the largest fish.

***ALL DECISIONS BY THE TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR ARE FINAL.**

****Only FISH (Kingdom Animalia, Phylum Chordata) are eligible for scoring**
